In this case, plaintiff sought recovery for noneconomic damages sustained after he was injured in an automobile accident. The trial court granted summary disposition, concluding that plaintiff's injuries did not constitute a serious impairment of body function or permanent serious disfigurement.

While <u>DiFranco</u> did not directly deal with the issue of permanent serious disfigurement, this Court has in the past applied <u>Cassidy</u> to the disfigurement cases. See <u>Shortridge</u> v <u>Bailey</u>, 145 Mich App 547; 378 NW2d 544 (1985); <u>Williams</u> v <u>Payne</u>, 131 Mich App 403; 346 NW2d 564 (1984). The trial court in the instant case appears to have followed suit and applied <u>Cassidy</u> to

the serious disfigurement issue as well. Accordingly, we direct the trial court to also reconsider the permanent serious disfigurement issue in light of $\underline{\text{DiFranco}}$.

Remanded for reconsideration in light of $\underline{\text{DiFranco}}$. We do not retain jurisdiction. No costs.
